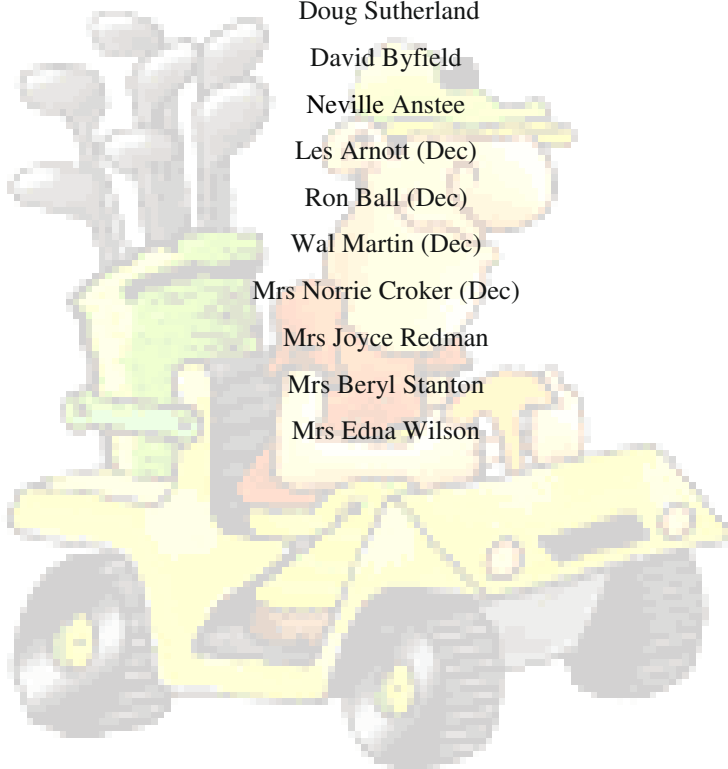

GENERAL INFORMATION

Social Events

Members are invited to support their Club by attending the many Social Events organised throughout the year.

Watch the notice boards and website for details of Club social events.

Mobile Phones

The possession of a mobile phone by a competitor or caddie is permitted, provided that whilst on the golf course during the event it is turned off at all times. The phone may only be used in cases of medical emergencies of which Complaints

All complaints must be made in writing to the relevant Match Committee who, if unable to satisfy them, shall submit the complaint to the Manager

Greens Maintenance:

The Wagga Golf Club's greens are normally cored during the months of March and August (weather permitting).

A notice will be placed in the Pro-Shop warning of the dates.

Behaviour

Golf is a sport of great tradition characterised by golfer's exemplary behaviour and fair play. No unacceptable behaviour will be tolerated and golfers must abide by the written and unwritten rules.

Unacceptable behaviour includes:

- Loss of temper
- Verbal abuse of officials or players
- Deliberately distracting or provoking opponents
- Throwing clubs
- Shouting, swearing or making unnecessary noise
- Cheating in any form including manipulating scores and moving a ball to improve its lie
- Damaging or littering the course



Consideration of Others

- The player whose honour it is should proceed immediately to the Teeing area to hit. Groups however are encouraged to play “ready Golf” i.e. “hit when ready” to eradicate “Slow Play”. In the interests of all, players should **“Play without delay”**.
- The player should not play if the group in front is still in Range.
- All players should carry and use sand buckets to repair divots on the fairway and use a divot tool to repair plug marks on the greens.

Safety on the Course

You know what to do in a case where your ball is heading in the direction of others: Yell **“Fore!”** as loud as you can. That is the international word of warning in golf. It lets golfers playing near you know that an errant golf ball might be heading their way, and they need to take cover. What should you do when *you* hear “fore!” being yelled in your direction? Cover up. Crouch behind your golf bag, get behind a tree, hide behind the cart, and cover your head with your arms. Make yourself a smaller target, and protect your head.

Players placed on their Honour

Golf is a game where normally there is no referee or umpire. Players are placed on their honour to play the game, as it not only concerns them but their partner and other members of the group. Players must observe and honour all the rules of Golf and local rules, and must immediately notify an opponent of any infringements and penalties that occur. It is the responsibility of all members to ensure the game is played according to the Rules.

Members’ Visitors

Members are welcome to bring guests on to the Course and into the Club House. All visitors must obey the rules and regulations of the Club both on and off the course as directed by the Professional or Manager. Signage in relation to acceptable standards of Dress and behaviour are on display in the Pro-Shop and at the front of the Pro-Shop.

Corporate and Charity Days

Corporate and Charity days will abide by the rules of the Club however, exception may be made for “Special Events”. These “Special Events” would apply where the course is booked exclusively for use by the Charity or Corporate group. Excessive amounts of Alcohol will not be allowed onto the course i.e. NO ESKIES



Infringements to be reported

It is the responsibility of every member to bring to the notice of the Golf committee any infringement of the Rules and Etiquette of Golf and these regulations. This report must be lodged immediately after the competition in writing and detailing the grounds for the report. Any acts of vandalism or unruly behaviour should be directed to the Pro-Shop or Manager. Please refer to NSWGA Disciplinary Policy. (Available in the Club)

Course Controller / Marshall

In the absence of any specifically designated Marshall the Professional and his staff have absolute discretion for the pace and conduct of the field (Competition or Social). All rules and regulations apply and all players will be monitored on the course. Any member or Visitor may be redirected or be asked to speed up play or let the group behind play through.

Discontinuance of Play

It is possible that the Manager or Golf Professional may deem the course unplayable or unsafe; to avoid confusion the Siren (Air Horn) will sound:

- ❖ First Siren Suspend Play. Cease play, mark and lift ball. Players may complete the hole being played and then cease.
- ❖ Second Siren – Resume Play
- ❖ Repeated Siren (two short blasts consecutively) – Abandon Play

Daily Activity and Playing Rights

On All Days, ALL PLAYERS must report to the Pro-Shop. All Players are to check if play is from the 1st or the 10th Tee's or both. All players must sign in for Social play, proof may be required. The penalty for breach of this condition is disqualification.

Time Sheets

Time Sheets are in the Pro Shop two weeks prior to an event. Any member who is unable to play when drawn, or to the time stated on the time sheet must notify the starter. All players are to report to Pro Shop at least 15 mins prior to tee-off time. Otherwise late comers will be placed at the end of the field (space permitting).

Count Backs

For 18 hole & 27 hole events the best score for the last 9 holes shall be used; if there is still a tie the last 6 holes, or if still tied the last 3 holes. If a tie still persists then hole by hole from the 18th.

In 36, 54 and 72 hole events the last 18 holes shall be used, and if still tied count back as above e.g. last 9 holes

In handicap events the relevant handicap or fraction thereof shall be applied.

Marking of Cards

Players are responsible for correctly recording their score at each hole in a legible manner, ensuring their correct handicap is shown and that the card is signed by themselves and their marker.

In 4BBB events the scorer for the team on each hole must be clearly identifiable.

The total score should be written in the appropriate areas on the top of the card and placed in the appropriate box within fifteen minutes of the completion of a round.

Failure to do so may result in the score not being included in the competition results.

Sub-Juniors playing in competition:

Sub-Juniors (under 16) are eligible to play in competitions only under the conditions laid down by the committee.

Stroke play: One (1) Sub-Junior may play with One (1) Full member in a group.

4BBB: Sub-Juniors may partner each other provided they play with One (1) Full member.

Vouchers

If you are a competition winner the value of the prize is credited to your Pro Shop card.

All prize vouchers are to be cleared by 30th June and 31st December or upon reaching \$200.00.

Priority on the Course

In the absence of Special rules

- All competitions are to be played where possible in groups of four, three or two. Only the Professional has the authority to send groups off in larger numbers.
- Groups are not to join up on the Course. If a group of 5 is sent out it will be the last group of that particular time. No groups larger than 5 are permitted at any time other than a three person Ambrose (Holden Scramble)
- Two ball matches should have precedence over and be entitled to pass any three or four ball match.
- A single Social player has no standing and must give way to a match of any kind.
- Any match playing a whole round is entitled to pass a match playing a shorter round.
- If a match fails to keep its place on the course and loses MORE than one clear hole on the players in front, it MUST allow the match following to pass.
- Social players have no priority on the course during competition.

The Professional and Staff have absolute authority to direct or redirect players in competition and for Social Golf.

CLUB COMPETITION RULES

Weekly Competitions

Tee Times will vary depending on the Season

Open to all classes of playing members and green fee players

Monday - Veterans 9 Hole Competition, 1st and 10th tees reserved between the hours of 6:30 – 10am or as required. Green Fee players may play outside the competition times.

Tuesday - Ladies 18/9 Hole Competition, 1st and 10th tees reserved between the hours of 6:30 – 10am or as required. Green Fee players may play outside the competition times.

Wednesday - Professional's Competition, open to all classes of playing members and green fee players. Both tees reserved. Green Fee players may play outside the competition times.

Thursday - Veterans 9 Hole Competition, 1st and 10th tees reserved between the hours of 6:30 – 10am or as required. Green Fee players may play outside the competition times.

Friday - Ladies 18/9 Hole Competition, 1st and 10th tees reserved between the hours of 6:30 – 10am or as required. Green Fee players may play outside the competition times.

Saturday

1st and 10th tees reserved for members' Ladies Business Girls 18 Hole and competition play. Green fee players may play outside this time.

Sunday and Public Holidays

1st and 10th tees open to all players, unless required for any competitions organised by either the Men's Club or the Ladies' Club, i.e. Club pennants, tee times may be reserved for Golfing Societies from 6.30 a.m. Similarly, The Manager of the Club may, at its discretion reserve the first tee for blocks of time to allow groups of golfers (e.g. fundraising organisations) to play their own competitions for members' competition play. Green fee players may play outside the competition times.

Pennant Fixtures

Pennant fixtures being played on the course have priority over all others.

HANDICAPS

Competition Grades

The handicap range and grades are adjusted to allow for an equal number of members in each grade. Generally the follows apply:

- Ten (10) players constitute a competition.
- 10-29 Players constitute 'A' Grade only.
- 31-80 Players constitute 'A' and 'B' Grades.
- 81 or more players constitute 'A', 'B' and 'C' Grades.

Competitions and Club Handicap Grading may be altered at the discretion of the Match Committee.

Handicap Limits

MEN Handicap is limit to 36

WOMEN Handicap is limit to 45.

Medley Competitions, there are usually two divisions in the medley competitions. These are determined on the number of players and are usually in the range of:

Division 1 scratch to 18 (inclusive)

Division 2 19 to 36 / 45 (inclusive)

Where competitions are played in divisions – the divisions shall be advised at the time.

RETENTION OF AN AGU / WGA HANDICAP

For AGU and WGA members a minimum of three (3) cards must be submitted in each 12 months period to retain a handicap.

NEW MEMBERS

It is the responsibility of all new members to acquaint themselves with the rules and regulations of the Club including dress regulations.

Handicap for New Members

To obtain an AGU (men's) handicap, a player is required to submit three (3) cards of 18 consecutive holes, marked by a registered Club Member possessing a handicap and clearly titled 'FOR HANDICAP' with membership number, if possible. It is acceptable to submit cards from other courses signed by a marker with an AGU or WGA handicap, as long as one (1) card is from Wagga City Club and signed by a Wagga City Member.

For a WGA (women's) handicap, the number of cards to be submitted is 3.

USE OF MOTORISED CARTS AND BICYCLES

Cart Usage

Only members of the Wagga Golf Club may bring their carts onto the course (see conditions). Carts are available for hire through the professional.

To use your own motorised cart and/or bicycle on the course you must register your vehicle when your subscription fees are due, and complete an "Application for Use of Motorised Transport and Indemnity & Waiver of Liability" form (available from the office).

Visitors may be granted admission on Medical Grounds. To arrange for a Visitor to bring their Cart on to the Course under those conditions the person should contact the Manager and provide the appropriate documentation. Only then will consideration be given



Condition affecting Carts on the Course

When a substantial amount of rain falls in the preceding 24 hrs the condition of the course will be rated by Course staff in consultation with the Professional or Club Manager. A decision will be made no later than 7.00am during Daylight saving and 8.00am during normal hours as to the suitability of the course for carts.

The course will be rated as below.

1st Tier: Members and social players may hire and use carts on the course. Members may use their privately owned carts (see Cart usage conditions)

2nd Tier: Members only to use carts on the course. ie their own or Hire. No Social players may take carts

3rd Tier: No Carts on the Course at all

Care should be taken to minimise wear and tear on the course by observing and practicing the following: Motorised carts or bicycles should not be driven:

- Carts are to be driven at walking pace only and be at least;
- Within 10 metres of the Green, Bunkers and Tee's
- On wet, muddy areas or GUR areas

Any player not observing these rules will forfeit the right to have a cart on the Course for a period of at least one month. Repeated breaches will be referred to the management.

Etiquette

It is expected that members and visitors will abide by the accepted rules and etiquette applying to the game of golf. Particular attention to be drawn to the following:

- No one should move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
- The player who has the honour should be allowed to tee off first in their group. If the players ahead are out of range, the player who has the honour should tee off before marking the card.
- No player should play until preceding players are out of range. Players should be aware of their capabilities when applying this principle
- All players should keep up with the group in front of them. Slow play can incur penalties from the Match Committees.

- Players searching for a ball should call the group behind through.
- Players must carry and use sand buckets to repair divots through the green. Players must repair pitch marks.
- Before leaving a bunker, the player should carefully repair all damage caused by the impact of the ball, footprints etc. Rakes must be replaced at the bottom of the bunker with the handle pointing towards the line of play on that particular hole.

Divots and Plug Marks:

It is each individual member and visitor's role to ensure Divots and Plug marks are repaired. Players observed not complying will be subject to disciplinary measures

Slow Play:

A round of Golf needs to be enjoyable for all on the course. Typically 9 holes should take 2 hours whilst 18 holes should take no more than 4 hours 15 minutes. The lowest marker in the group is the designated "leader".

If your group loses a ball or its place in the field the low marker should insure the group behind is called through. Your place in the field is directly behind the group in front, not in front of the group behind.

DRESS REGULATIONS:

General Dress

Members and visitors are required to be neatly, cleanly dressed and attired at all times as per the Clubs Policy (on display in the Pro-Shop and front of the Club).

Dress Code for players and caddies

Appropriate golf attire including Trousers and shorts must be clean. Polo type round neck golf shirts are permitted

Pocket sized logos are acceptable.

Short socks are acceptable providing that they are mainly white and are neat and clean.

Golf shoes with Soft Spikes should be worn. Shoes that are not golf shoes must enclose the feet and have fl at soles (such as runners). No thongs, sandals or Metal Spikes.

Tracksuit bottoms, Football Guernsey's, cricket shirts, Singlet tops and stubbies etc are NOT permitted. Shirts must not have excessive advertising or offensive logos.

Unruly behaviour and non compliance with the rules is not acceptable and players may be asked to leave the course.

Lady Golfers Dress on the Course

Lady Golfers MUST be neatly dressed at all times.

Short shorts, tight jeans, sun-tops and sundresses are NOT permitted.

House Rules

In the Clubhouse members and guests must be respectably dressed in the manner expected according to Golf Club dress

Regulations Clothing and equipment is not to be left on the premises unless under the control of the Professional.

Notices may not be displayed in the Club or on the course without prior consent of the Management.

No canvassing for donations, raffles or the like unless permission is granted from the management.

Children are welcome in the Club however must remain under the strict supervision of an adult and not disturb fellow members.

Hat and caps of any description are not permitted to be worn in the Club House

Modes of Play

Stroke - The score at each hole is entered on the scorecard, totalled and the player's full handicap then deducted. The player who completed the stipulated round in the fewest strokes will be the winner.

Par Event - In par the score is entered on the card in the same way as in stroke play with the exception of where the score exceeds par for the hole. This is determined by allowing for the handicap stroke as shown in the stroke index column. For example, a player with a handicap of 18 will add one shot to the par value for each hole to determine their par of the hole. Thus a hole rated as a par 4 becomes a par 5 for the player. If the player has 6 or more the score need not be written in. As soon as a player is beaten by par the ball shall be picked up.

If the score is less than par then the result is a '+' sign for a win. If equal to par then a '0' sign for a half and a '-' sign for a loss. At the end of the round the plus and minus scores are added and the result is written on the top of the card.

Individual Stableford - The scoring method is calculated by allocating two points for a par, One point for one over, Three points for one under, 4 points for two under, 5 points for three under. Players who exceed their own par by two strokes score no points on that hole and since they cannot improve their score should pick up their ball and record no score on their card. At the end of the round points are added for each 9 and totalled for the 18 holes. The player with the most points wins.

Four-ball Best Ball (4BBB) Stableford - The Stableford system is used for this competition. Two players play as partners; the hole is played by each of them using their individual full handicaps. At the completion of the hole, the player recording the highest number of points has his or her score entered on the card. If both score equally the player who first completed the hole shall be recorded. To speed up play it is customary to pick up once it is impossible to better your partners score.

Four Ball Aggregate Stableford - The individual Stableford system is again played under the same Stableford format as with the 4BBB Stableford Event. Individual Handicaps are applied for each member and scores for each player are recorded for each hole as well as the aggregate (total of both) for the team. Players total and combined total should be recorded at the end of each 9 hole. The total of each player should add up to the aggregate score. Note that strokes and points should be recorded for each individual when marking the card

Four-ball Match Play - Reduce the stroke play handicaps of all players by the handicap of the lowest marker, who will then play off scratch. Each of the other three players is then allowed their resulting handicap with strokes at the holes indicated in the match play index.

Foursomes - Foursomes is a stroke event played with a partner and using only one ball. As in all competitions it can be played for men, women and mixed. The rules require partners to hit off from alternate tees. Players agree on their selection of either odds or even holes. This decision is entirely the players. Once a player has teed off they hit alternate shots until the completion of the hole. If either player incurs a penalty it does not alter the rotation of play. Scoring is identical to the simple method of stroke play and should show both gross and net scores after handicap deduction. The team's handicap is half of the aggregate of both partners' handicaps.

Canadian Foursomes - Played with a partner where both players tee off on all holes. They then decide which ball is in the best position and the other ball is taken out of play. If player A hit the selected ball from the tee, then player B will hit the next shot and vice versa. Play continues on an alternate basis until the hole is completed. Incurring a penalty shot does not affect the order of play.

Since the event is stroke it is scored that way with the card showing the gross and net score.

American Foursomes - Played in the same manner as Canadian Foursomes except that each player shall play their second stroke with their partners' ball before selecting the ball with which to continue the hole on an alternate basis.

Medley - Where both women and men compete in the same competition, with the women playing from the red tees and men from the blue or white tees.

Par Bisque - The competitor is allowed to choose on the tee before the start of each hole whether or not they will allocate any handicap strokes to the hole. The competitor must mark on the card how many strokes are to be used before starting the hole. Once the handicap is used up, no more strokes can be allocated. Any unused handicap strokes left at the 18th are forfeited.

Three Stick Event - Only three golf clubs plus putter may be carried and used by the player.

Ambrose Competition - An Ambrose can be played by two, three or four members. In short all players hit from the tee and the best ball is selected. All players then play from this position by dropping the ball within one club length no nearer the hole. If the ball selected is in the rough or hazard the other balls must be dropped in the same position. This procedure is followed until holing out. On the putting green the ball shall be placed no more than one putter head length from the original. The tee shot of each member must be taken at least 4 times. Handicaps: 4 person 1/8th of total handicap (each player must take 3 tee shots) 3 person 1/6th of total handicap (each player must take 4 tee shots) 2 person 1/4 of total handicap (each player must take 6 tee shots).
